After School Care

Kelly Club provides before and after school care, Monday to Friday, onsite in the school hall. They also offer a holiday programme during the school holidays. Further information can be obtained from our school website.

Assemblies

Assemblies are held once or twice a term to celebrate success and to share outcomes of special programmes or events. These are notified through the school newsletter and on the school website.

Attendance

The first step to finding success at school is attendance.

We encourage our parents to use <u>HERO</u> for all absentees and include a reason for the absence. It is important to remember that if your child is absent from school they will be marked 'truant' unless you have notified the school of their absence.

If a student is unable to attend school, parents should notify the school office before 9.15am by either HERO or by calling the office.

If a student arrives late to school, they must report to the school office when they arrive and sign in.

If a student is required to leave early, please notify their class teacher. Parents must sign their children out at the school office before leaving the school.

Bicycles

The school encourages safe cycling practices and we expect children to ride and scooter to school. Helmets and high vis vests are compulsory for all cyclists and those students riding a scooter to school.

Book Club

Twice per term Scholastic Book Club brochures are sent home with children. The books are ordered online only. There is no obligation to buy these books but they are realistically priced and cater for all ages and abilities. The school does not receive any sales profit.

Buses

Bayes Transport provides a bus service to and from school. Departs Hatfield's Beach at 8.20am. Departs Orewa Primary school at 3.00pm. Details of the bus route are available from the school office.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are not permitted for students at school. Any student who needs a cell phone for after school use can leave it with their teacher or at the school office during school hours.

Children Arriving Early

We discourage early arrival at school. Children who do arrive before 8.30am are required to wait at the school gates until the bell rings.

Concerns

Should you have a concern or query about your child, we ask that you first contact your child's teacher. All other concerns or complaints should be directed to the Deputy Principal or Principal. Please follow the complaints and concerns procedures outlined on our website under Policies and Procedures.

Dental Clinic

Hats

It is compulsory for children to wear hats outside during Terms One and Four. A hat is part of the compulsory school uniform and is designed to offer the greatest protection from the sun without getting in the way when playing. We encourage students to wear the hat outside at all times.

Hearing/Vision Testing

Hearing and vision tests are carried out on a regular basis by the regional health authority. These visits are notified in the newsletter and on our website.

Homework

We generally expect homework to consist of reading each night, as well as any specific set tasks that are assigned by the classroom teacher. This could involve maths, writing, reading and/or project based activities.

Newsletters

Newsletters are sent out via HERO in our community feed and are also available on our website. These are generally sent out weekly and contain relevant information for upcoming events, as well as showcasing our wonderful tamariki.

Parent Group (PTA)

This organisation exists to enhance the spirit of co-operation between parents, teachers and the community. This committee of parents and community friends meet twice per term to organise fund-raising activities such as fortnightly sausage sizzles and school wide events. Parking

The car park is for staff and visitors only throughout the school day. Unfortunately, we cannot cater for any parents to park as a pick up point after school, as there are too many students and insufficient parking spots. If you require a parking pass for access due to a disability, we can issue these upon request.

Pick-ups and drop offs

This can be a very busy time for parents and children. It is vital that the drop off zone is not used for parking. Cars should be able to flow freely within a two minute time frame for pick-ups and drop offs. We kindly ask that you circulate the bay until your child is ready to be picked up.

Policies

Reporting to Parents

Reports are under review this year, as we navigate the curriculum changes set by the government. In general, we aim to communicate your child's progress at student learning conferences, as well as in written reports that are sent to parents toward the end of Term 2 and Term 4. Road Patrol

The school monitors the Maire Road crossing outside the school from 8.30am – 9.00am and from 2.55pm – 3.10pm.

School Contribution

School Payments

Working together with Kindo and ezlunch, our School offers you a simple and quick way to view and pay for items, order lunches, support fundraisers, purchase event tickets and complete registrations.

This is our preferred method of payment and we encourage you to set-up your myKindo account today. You can pay via POLi or bank transfer (no fees) or with Visa, Mastercard, American Express, UnionPay (fees apply). Add regular top-ups if you'd like, then allocate to payments when you're ready, or just pay as you go.

Stationery

Supervision Before and After School

Children are supervised from 8.30am until school finishes at 2.55pm. Bus children remain supervised until their bus leaves. For safety reasons, parents should pick up children no later than 3.15pm as there is limited supervision after this time. Any students who are not collected after 3:15pm on a regular basis will be encouraged to register their child with Kelly Club.

Toys at School

The school does not accept any responsibility for toys brought to school and discourages children from bringing them.

Uniform

The school uniform is compulsory. Navy socks, black shoes / sandals are to be worn as part of the uniform. Hair accessories, ribbons, ties are to be navy blue, burgundy, sand or black. Watches and stud earrings can be worn. School uniform is available from NZ Uniforms.

Visitors

All visitors to the school must sign in at the office upon arriving at school and sign out when leaving.

Walking School Bus
